Campus COVID19 Cases - Reminder

- Here is what happens if we have an on-campus COVID19 case:
 - Each day you come to campus, complete your **Daily Wellness Screening**.
 - If any person develops symptoms within 48 hours after being on-campus, notify healthandsafety@seattlecolleges.edu
 - Contact-tracers will respond by:

What do contact-tracers do?

- Interview the sick individual to identify potential-exposure:
 - Were they on-campus during their contagious period?
 - Did they have close-contacts?
 - Use data from Daily Wellness Screening to contact and direct those who might have been exposed.
 - Ensure the occupied space(s) have been cleaned & disinfected.
 - Notify campus leadership (anonymously).

What to do if you find out someone has COVID19?

- Instruct the person to contact healthandsafety@seattlecolleges.edu
- **AND**
- Notify healthandsafety@seattlecolleges.edu

- Do not announce to others someone else's personal health information or diagnosis. To do so violates the person's right and ability to manage their own information.
 - Any need-to-know information (like exposure) will be notified directly and confidentially by district H&S.

This is a Well-Seasoned Plan

- Developed in collaboration with state & local public health agencies
- We've had rapid notification, testing, and quarantine responses
- Although we've inevitably had on-campus cases, we have no evidence on-campus transmission
- Areas to focus on:
 - Car pools
 - Breaks, lunch, and socializing

Students ranked from 1= highest and 5 = lowest

- Interpretation of instructional modality preference among these respondents should bear in mind that these respondents are primarily taking courses through virtual modalities of instruction.
- Caution: Findings from this survey cannot be generalized to students who are no longer taking classes because they prefer in – person instruction.

Instruction Update

- Winter Quarter:

 - Online (asynchronous)
 - Virtual hybrid
